
## Rugged Perennials for Deer Resistance



- A. Rudbeckia 'Herbstsonne' (coneflower)
- B. Paeonia Pink (peony)
- C. Dicentra spectabilis (bleeding heart)
- **D.** Astilbe purple
- E. Iris 'Caesar's Brother' (siberian iris)
- F. Crocosmia 'Lucifer' (montbretia)
- G. Hemerocallis 'Stella D'Oro' (daylily)
- **H.** Liatris spicata (blazing star)
- I. Geranium himalayense (cranesbill)
- J. Convallaria (lily of the valley)

## **Planting Instructions**

While you're preparing the hole, let the roots soak in a container of warm water.

- 1. Choose a location that receives full to part sun.
- 2. Dig a hole wide enough to easily spread the roots and at least 20 cm (8" deep).
- 3. Amend soil if necessary by mixing a 1 part peat moss, 1 part compost to 3 parts earth.
- 4. Water the soil mixture.

## You're now ready to plant.

- 5. Fill the half of the hole with the prepared soil mixture.
- 6. Place the roots and/ or bulbs at the depth noted on the label of the package
- 7. Fill in the hole and thoroughly water.

## **After Care**

- 8. Continue to water and disbud any faded blooms throughout the summer season.
- 9. In the fall or early spring remove the faded leaves and debris from last years growth.

Store in a cool dry place for up to 2 weeks after receiving. Plant outdoors once evening temperatures stay above 6-8 C or start in containers indoors.
