The Ecuadorian Equation: A Future for Cocoa Farmers in the Amazon

Costco also sources some cocoa from Ecuador for the Sassandra program. We supported a recently completed program with our partners Blommer and Heifer International that was aimed at improving the living conditions of cocoa farmers in the Ecuadorian Amazon. This project ran from December 2018 to October 2019. Below is a summary of the Objectives, Goals and the Results of this program.
